PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



Principal's Report

It is hard to believe that we are now into the fourth week of this term, and time is flying by. There are a number of major events coming up in what is the remainder of this term that involves students. The first of these is the Adelaide Show. Once again as we have done for many years the Ag Show Team will be making their way to Adelaide on September 8th, with engagement in the led steer and carcass competition. Whilst this date is somewhat away the lead up work is (as it has been for several months) in full swing and that date is closer than we think.

The second major event is the Adelaide Festival of Choirs. This event is held in late September and involves students in Year 5-7. Once again this event is the culmination of months of practice. The students selected to participate will be part of the Choir that performs on the evening Wednesday 9th September.

Parent Feedback Requested.

Please refer to the article about the continuation of an annual school magazine as republished in this newsletter. To date we have had no feedback and only one extra copy ordered. At current order, the publication of a school magazine 2015 is just not economically viable and tells us that it has lost its value. We seek your urgent opinions and or orders.

External Review.

The Department for Education and Child Development has introduced an external review process as part of its continuing school improvement priority. This is the first year of this new process . All DECD schools will be reviewed over the next four years. The review of Meningie Area School will occur in Week 10 of this term. Monday 21st and Tuesday 22nd of September. The reviewers will seek information in a range of forums inclusive of staff, students, and parents/ caregivers over the two days including a meeting with Governing Council. I refer you to the following article and process for consent in talking with students. Additionally, if you would like further information please contact me, by calling the office. Several schools in the Coorong Mallee Partnership have already been through this process, and all sites will be reviewed within the four year cycle.

National Recognition Week School Services Officers.

This week is School Services Officers (SSO) week. It is a chance to publicly recognize the amazing contribution that these people do in contributing to the school and wider community. Whilst the roles of an SSO in the school vary widely inclusive of the following Front Office duties, First Aid, Finances, in-class support of students in their learning and wellbeing, grounds, ICT and Community Library Assistant. A morning tea was held Wednesday morning as an acknowledgement of their on going work and commitment to Meningie Area School.

SCHOOL MAGAZINE

For as long as I can remember and some research shows that for the last 35 years or more Meningie Area School has produced an annual school magazine. Within it there are a series of reports including that of the Principal and Governing Council Chairpersons reports and that of sub school managers. Every class has a page which includes photos, various articles and highlights of their year. There are sporting reports, music reports and photographs, the Captains' report and a record of prize winners. Every year the School Magazine though is slightly different and it has evolved over time and with changing technology. The preparation of the school magazine is time consuming and probably is in the order of 100 hours including the time that a teacher spends in forming up before being sent for production. On top of that is the cost of production. The quote for the production of the 2015 Meningie Area School Magazine is \$1,096.86 and is based on an order of 65 Magazines. The school magazine is on the book list at a cost of \$18.00 this year. To date we have an order for only 23 copies. This number is not viable . Unless we have at least another 35 orders we will not proceed with a Meningie Area School Magazine 2015.

The bigger question though given the small number of pre orders for this year and a steady decline over the past few years is about the relevance and value that the school community has with regard to an Annual Magazine.

We are interested in your opinion. As you can see there is a huge investment in time and money that goes into the annual magazine. Equally orders can still be made through the Front Office at a cost of \$18.00 per copy. It has been quite a journey for Isobell over the past two years, as Isobell in her own words says:

I was a Successful Applicant in 2013 into a Diploma of Narrative Approaches for Aboriginal People (Counselling, Group and Community Work), where I undertook my studies at Nunkuwarrin Yunti in Adelaide. I successfully completed the Diploma in June 2015.

The Diploma was particularly suited to Aboriginal workers from various Social and Emotional Wellbeing Roles where counselling duties maybe a significant part of their duties in some way.

I was required to do my studies in Blocks and externally which meant I was away from my family from weeks at a time, which was hard. As I have been learning this way of counselling, over the past 2 years I have implemented it within my work when supporting students and also in my personal life. The Course has strengthened me not only as a worker but within myself, I never had thought that I would ever get this far with my studies being so wearing at times, trying to manage work, being a mother and trying to study away but I pushed through.

I appreciate that Meningie Area School has supported me being able to complete the Diploma and look forward to working with this further in the Future.

Training for Parents of Teenagers (TPOT) Research Study

FREE training for parents to help the mental and physical health of teenagers

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED - SOUTH AUSTRALIA!

Who is running the project?

The Centre for Mental Health at The University of Melbourne.

Who can take part?

Parents with teenagers aged between 12-15 years within Australia (one parent and one teenager per family). This includes Educators or other Staff who are parents.

What are the aims?

The project aims to teach parents the skills to recognize and respond to mental health problems in teenagers as well as first aid injuries and to evaluate the training offered.

Researchers are interested to see if the skills taught to parents are used on teenagers and whether this benefits a teenager's health in the longer term.

What's in it for me?

A \$50 Coles/Myer Gift Card after course attendance! This is to acknowledge parents' time commitment (2 days) and travel expenses.

Parents receive the training course, materials and Certificate of completion for FREE.

Note: To be eligible, you must not have undertaken training in the previous three years in Mental Health First Aid (MHFA), Youth MHFA or physical First Aid.

- 14-hour Youth Mental Health First Aid which teaches adults the skills to recognise the early signs of mental illness, identify potential mental health-related crises, and assist teenagers to get professional help.
- 15-hour (HLTAID003) Australian Red Cross Provide First Aid which teaches the skills to sustain life, reduce pain and minimise the consequences of injury and illness until professional help arrives.

During online registration, parents will need to select two courses but a computer will randomly place them into one course or the other.

Telephone interview prior to training

Before parents can attend their allocated training course, they and their teenager will be required to undertake an individual 20 to 30 minute telephone survey, which will ask about knowledge and attitudes about health problems.
