MENINGIE 150 YEAR CELEBRATION

We are all looking forward to our community celebrations this weekend. One of the key initiatives that the school has been involved in is the re-enactment of the mail run.

Students from Reception to Year 7 have been writing letters to be taken on the PS Oscar W and delivered to students at Milang and Goolwa schools. Students at these sites will be sending their mail on the PS Oscar W as well. Our students are also writing a letter to themselves as these letters will travel on the PS Oscar W to Milang where they will be loaded onto a 1925 Studebaker Buckboard to travel to Strathalbyn. Once in Strathalbyn the mail will travel to Mt Barker on the Steam Ranger. On Monday morning the mail will be loaded into a 1929 Graham Paige Sedan, similar to those used in the original mail run, and travel to the main post office in Adelaide. Students from our site are travelling down to Adelaide on the Monday morning to participate in the ceremony as the mail arrives at the post office.

For students and community members who are interested come and join us at the Sailing Club at 9am on Saturday where we will be meeting the PS Oscar W and handing over our mail bags.


CANTEEN CLOSURE


















Emergency Foster Carers Needed


