## **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:**

Today is Remembrance Day, which commemorates the 98<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of World War 1. This is a time when we remember all of those who have lost their lives in times of war, whether as soldiers, airmen, sailors or nurses fighting on either side of conflict, or civilians inadvertently caught up in the horror that war brings.

It is a time to reflect on the terrible price that is paid, both at the individual and family level, and as a nation as a whole. At the outbreak of World War 1, Australia had a population of approximately 5 million people. Of that relatively small population over 300,000 men and women left our shores to fight in the "War To End All Wars". Of those, 60,000 lost their lives while another

150,000 were injured, many crippled by the effects of gas, or amputation of limbs. Many more struggled with what we now know as PTSD, although it was often not recognised at all back then. Even though they had survived the conflict, their lives were often cut short by the ongoing effects of this conflict.

10 years ago today, I, along with a number of members of the first Connecting Spirits trip, had the privilege of sitting in a VIP box around the Arc de Triomphe in Paris to watch the ceremony to remember the war dead there. In 2006 there were only 4 men left still alive of the millions who fought for France, and these 4 were all special guests of the French President, Jacques Chirac, under the Arc. This was the last year that any World War 1 veterans from France attended that ceremony.

10 years on and the number of World War 2 and Korean veterans is now diminishing, and many of our Vietnam veterans are also getting on in years. Meanwhile there are a large number of younger men and women who have served in Afghanistan and Iraq who should also be remembered, not just today, for the sacrifice that they made in service of our country.

Today is also a time for reflection on what it would be like to live in a world that is not impacted by war. Perhaps as individuals there is little that we can do on a global scale, but if each of us were to reflect and try to reduce the conflict in our own little part of the world, our family, our neighbourhood, our community and our country, then maybe we could all find the peace that is the wish of the vast majority of humanity.

Whilst 41 of our students, Mr Love and 3 teachers were returning from the Canberra excursion today, the remainder of the students and teachers at the school attended the Remembrance Day Service at the Meningie Memorial Park.

I would also like to recognise the tremendous work that Kathryn Hese and her team do in preparing our students and supporting them through the process of achieving their SACE at the end of Year 12.

There is a Whole School Assembly on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> November at 10.30 to farewell the 2016 Year 12 Meningie Area School students. Recognition Awards will also be presented. Everyone is welcome to attend.

## YEAR 9-10 AG & SCIENCE EXCURSION

As part of our Agricultural and Science studies we have been focusing on Genetics and the patterns of inheritance. On Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> November we were fortunate enough to be involved in the Artificial Insemination (AI) of some Flairdale Poll Merino Ewes. Margie Trowbridge, of Brecon Breeders, performed the AI, with our students on hand to help out. Margie gave the students a first-hand look at the semen samples and each had an opportunity to look down the scope into the Ewes uterus to see how the process works. Both Margie and Wayne Lehmann gave students an insight into how and why farming has taken to Artificial Breeding and why it is of particular importance for stud breeders today. It was fantastic to see some of our students getting involved in the session. Thank you to Wayne and Margie for giving us this opportunity.




